What do these countries have in common? They don't have similar cultures, people groups, or languages. They do all have a student(s) going to them that has been a part of our ministry at some point. How exciting to look at our past years of ministry and see how the Lord is producing Christ-centered laborers all around the world!!

Last summer, when Ed went to Senegal, he had the awesome privilege of serving alongside both Dayton and Donald. Dayton was a student of ours at Transylvania Univ. in KY and after graduating, he spent two years in Senegal ministering to a people group that is predominately Muslim. He is currently attending graduate school and continues to go back to Senegal every year leading a summer project where he takes students with him. Donald will be traveling to Senegal in August to serve for a year or two ministering to this same people group!

in NC. Since she has the summers off, she has decided to go serve with her church in Estonia teaching English camps and engaging in relational ministry seeking to share the message of Christ with the students.

The Mitchell twins, Whitney and Laurie, were also students at Transylvania Univ. They graduated, attended graduate school, and then landed jobs working in the sports department of a large university, but they both decided to take 6 months off to go with their church to host sports camps in Malaysia with the hope of developing relationships and sharing the Gospel. They saw the Lord do amazing things, developed lasting relationships with people there, and are now working full-time in the states.

Alyssa was a student I discipled at Georgetown College in KY. Through mission work, she developed a huge heart for Muslim people. She married a man with these same passions and they have decided to go to Turkey long-term to minister to Muslim people through evangelism, church planting, and discipleship. We are so excited for them and this long-term move!

Our heart truly is for the Lord to produce life-long laborers out of our ministries. Thank you for being a part of joining us to change the world for Christ!
