As I (Jenny, a staff lady on the ENC team) approached Alexis on the steps of the student center at Central Carolina Community College, I instantly knew that she had been crying.

"Are you okay?" I asked her. She nodded yes. I told her that I was on campus getting to know students and I had a picture survey that asked 5 questions that I would love for her to help me with. She agreed, appreciating the distraction. Before the survey even began, I learned that Alexis was a 17 year old who was in the Early College program at CCCC.

I asked the first question, "Pick 3 pictures that best describe your life right now". As she quickly picked her pictures, I noticed that they were the darkest pictures from the stack - dark colors, dark scenes, just plain ole' dark.

As she started explaining why she picked the first picture, which was a picture of someone walking through a cemetery, she began to tear up. She explained to me that her exboyfriend had just died in a car accident a few days before. She continued to share how she had also been kicked out of her home a few months back and all she wanted to do was to go back home to her mom. "I need therapy, I need to go to church, and I need to pray," she confessed to me.

"Are You Okay?"

Sensing that Alexis desired and needed to hear about the hope that is found in Christ, I asked her "All those things may help, but can I show and explain something that has given me hope in difficult times, just like what you are experiencing now?" Through her tears, she mouthed "Yes!"

I shared with her about the hope that is found in Christ and about how she can begin a personal relationship with Him. She confessed very clearly to me that this is what she wanted and needed in her life. Right outside the student center, Alexis prayed to receive Christ!

Alexis and I have talked quite a few times since then and are planning to meet regularly to go through followups on how she can grow in her relationship with Christ.

Jenny's story is just one of many that we have to share as a result of seeing the Lord change students' lives. Our team has seen 9 students place their faith in Christ so far this semester. Praise the Lord for divine appointments!
